

Data Analysis From 68 Countries and 2947 U.S. Counties

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Every day, people all over the world are bombarded with propaganda about the need for everyone to get a COVID-19 vaccine. We are told that the vaccines are safe and effective, that COVID-19 remains a threat to humanity, and that we cannot go back to normal until everyone is vaccinated. None of this is true, particularly concerning vaccines. There is ample evidence that the vaccines are not safe, and a growing body of evidence showing that they are not at all effective.

An analysis of data from 68 countries and 2947 U.S. counties as of September 3 2021 concluded that there is no relationship between vaccination status and COVID-19 case numbers.

The 68 countries were included based on the availability of population data, along with data concerning second doses and COVID-19 cases. Researchers computed the cases per one million people and the percentage of the population that was fully vaccinated in each country.

The analysis showed that there was no discernable relationship between the percentage of the population that was fully vaccinated and new COVID-19 cases. In fact, the opposite held true. The higher the percentage of fully vaccinated people, the higher the number of COVID-19 cases.

For example, in Israel over 60% of the population is fully vaccinated. Yet Israel reported the highest number of COVID-19 cases per one million people. The results were similar in Iceland and Portugal. In both countries, over 75% of the population is fully vaccinated and both countries reported more COVID-19 cases per million people than countries like Vietnam and South Africa in which only 10% of the population is vaccinated.

The analysis of U.S. counties showed the same result; no connection between a high percentage of vaccinated people and lower numbers of COVID-19 cases. Of the five counties that reported the highest percentage of fully vaccinated people, the Centers for Disease Control identified four of them as high transmission counties. Three of these counties reported that 90% of their citizens were fully vaccinated.

Conversely, of the 57 counties that were classified as low transmission counties by the CDC, 26.3% reported that less than 20% of their residents were fully vaccinated.

Based on these data, any risk associated with the vaccines is not justified because there simply is no benefit.

The researchers concluded by emphasizing the need to "...strike the balance of learning to live with COVID-19 in the same manner we continue to live a 100 years later with various seasonal alterations of the 1918 Influenza virus."
